WHAT IS A GARDENER

A gardener is not instantly recognisable because he blends in with the background, especially if the background is a compost heap.

His features, human enough during the week are blurred at the weekends by two day stubble. His hair falls uncombed, full of bits of straw and twigs. Sometimes he wears a floppy hat thing, that can't be described as anything else, owing to it's shape, which is roughly that of a dead cat draped over a gatepost.

Around him is a permanent fug, emanating from a filthy old pipe fuelled by a revolting thick twist which he is not allowed to smoke indoors. The fug is not just for pleasure - it keeps the flies off.

His upper person is draped with a set of drooping pockets held together by what used to be Harris tweed. His lower person supports, just about, a former pair of trousers, worn low for comfort and ventilation.

Jacket trousers and wellies might seem easy enough to identify, but recognition is complicated by the layer of dried mud, twigs, bark, bits of leaf and grass clippings which cover the whole shoot. This makes it all the more essential to differentiate fully between a gardener and a compost heap.

STEAMING

A compost heap is a motionless pile of rubbish, sometimes gently steaming. A gardener is a moving pile of rubbish, sometimes gently steaming. If the heap is mobile and vertical, it is likely to be a gardener in a reasonable state of health. If the heap is motionless and horizontal it is likely to be a compost heap, an unsupported gardener or a gardener to whom something untoward has happened.

Once your suspicions have been aroused, check by (a) Looking at both ends of the heap. If it is a gardener there will be wellies one end and a floppy hat thing the other end. (b) In the absence of either, shout in a loud voice "Hey up they're open!" If the heap is a gardener, in any condition but stone dead, it should stir.
